History of the Foundation

The Broward Education Foundation

In the fall of 1983, a few community activists had been working on a program called the “Total Child” to support the Broward County school system. In response to the hard work and success of these dedicated women and in alignment with the District’s Comprehensive Plan for Education, Dr. William McFatter, Superintendent of Schools at-the-time, recommended to the school board that this group operate as the Board’s affiliated Foundation. His motion was approved on November 21, 1983 and the Foundation was officially chartered in August 1984.

In addition to Dr. McFatter, among some of the other individuals credited with launching the organization were Mrs. Selma Hopen of the BCMA Auxiliary; Dr. Linda Murray, an associate superintendent; Dr. Dorothy Orr a prominent educator and advocate; and, Mrs. Bertha Smolian, who provided the seed money and first donation of \$5,000. Dr. William C. Drainer, former Broward County Schools Superintendent, served as the Foundation’s first chairman.

By 1985, the Foundation was able to award 20 mini-grants to teachers for classroom projects. In 1989, a fulltime executive director was appointed, Ruthe Lowy, and the first fundraiser for scholarships was held. The BRACE (Broward

Advisors for Continuing Education) scholarship program was established to provide scholarships to qualifying students who had exhausted all avenues for financial aid and still fell short of the funds needed to pursue postsecondary education. In the ensuing years, the Teacher Mini-grant Program was expanded to include the Citibank Success Fund and IMPACT II, a national program designed to recognize and reward innovative teachers.

As the Foundation entered the 21st Century, support for student success Pre-K to grade 12 emerged as the premiere program of support for the Foundation. In 2015, more than \$250,000 was distributed in grant awards to innovative teachers and to support emerging quality education programs.

In April 1990, the name of the Foundation was changed to Broward Education Foundation, Inc., and in May of that same year, the Foundation became a Direct Support Organization of the School Board. The following year, the first School Board employee campaign was held raising \$43,000.

For the next ten years, the Broward Education Foundation continued to grow and expand raising funds, hosting award ceremonies and galas,

recognizing Broward County student alumni for their community efforts, and implementing important programming for students in need, especially those in low-income areas. The Foundation Gala, begun as part of an effort to raise scholarship funds, has changed its focus to become a community engagement event celebrating the accomplishments of the Foundation and to honor outstanding philanthropists and partners in our mission.

In 2001, the Foundation initiated a program for students in need, specifically those lacking basic school supplies. Tools for Schools Broward began as a storefront with a location at Fort Lauderdale High School. Teachers from throughout the County traveled to “shop” for free school supplies to equip their students with the necessary tools for learning. Tools for Schools Broward is now in Pompano Beach, Florida, occupying approximately 7,087 square feet (3,076 square feet shopping area and 4,011 square feet of warehouse). By 2015, annual distribution of school supplies to teachers from schools with large numbers of students from economically challenged families received more than \$1M in donated school supplies.

Today, the Broward Education Foundation is governed by a thirty member Board of Directors, with eleven working committees and an annual operating budget of \$2.2M. The Foundation’s essential programs for support are Innovative Teaching, Scholarships and Tools for Schools Broward. In addition, the Foundation serves as a fiduciary agent for more than 200 funds set up by individuals and groups whose mission is in harmony with ours. The Foundation continues to serve as a catalyst for educational excellence and support for the amazing work in the Broward County Public Schools.

Innovative Teaching Programs



Innovative Teaching Programs give teachers and school-based administrators the opportunity to implement innovative programs through grants, workshops, publications, an annual expo, and other professional development training. Innovative Teaching Programs connect outstanding teachers, improve classroom instruction, keep good teachers teaching and provide long lasting effects for students.

Innovative Teaching Grants

The Broward Education Foundation's Teacher Grant Program is designed to provide startup funds to teachers who design and implement innovative, creative and effective classroom experiences that improve the level of student achievement, and increase the likelihood that students will stay in school and graduate. In the 2015 school year, the Broward Education Foundation awarded \$186,000 to 298 of our most successful teachers benefitting more than 20,000 students.

Next Move

The Broward Education Foundation's Scholastic Chess program teaches critical thinking skills through an interactive curriculum in chess for students throughout Broward County. Next Move is designed to enhance the District-wide initiative for scholastic chess instruction our schools. Through scholastic chess, students improve academic performance, self-confidence, creativity, and problem-solving abilities. In 2015, 166 educators were trained to provide this program in schools and countywide programs.

No Debate About It

The School District is committed to implementing debate programs in all high schools and middle schools. The Broward Education Foundation's support for No Debate About It helps to provide equal opportunity in debate competitions for students across the district. The Foundation funds tournament fees and transportation for students from lower economic neighborhoods in Broward County. In its fourth year, the Debate program has reached 29 high schools and 28 middle schools.

Garden Delights

The Broward Education Foundation's Garden Delights – Team Up for Healthy Choices program provides STEM curriculum-based instruction in nutrition and biology through a student-centered “seed to table” curriculum. Students plant, maintain and harvest edible gardens over the course of the school year while learning the value of healthy food choices. The Foundation in FY 15 supported 16 school gardens with continued community engagement strategies to expand this program.

P.L.E.A.S.E.

Scheduled for implementation in 2016, the P.L.E.A.S.E program is a targeted and layered character and life skills curriculum, based on the acquisition of critical thinking skills that empowers students to develop positive values and the behaviors that enable them to thrive. P.L.E.A.S.E engages corporate community members in supporting students' “soft skill” development for the workplace, higher education and life achievements.

LEEO

The Linking Educational and Employment Outcomes (LEEO) program assists students to attain industry certifications and hands-on work experience with a focus on health science, career technical programs and internships. Partnerships have been established with local businesses that have identified significant gaps in both technical skills and current employability skills. In the 2015 school year, LEEO reached 2,540 students in thirteen target schools.

In Memoriam - Bill Ellis

Joining the board in 2008, Bill Ellis always had a big heart and a passion for the success of children and that translated in many ways at the Foundation. He was a leader in setting up the Tools for School Broward program in January 2010. With the support of Pirtle Construction, Bill arranged every detail of the resource store so that upon completion the facility was ready to serve our Broward County Public School teachers. Many have said, “without Bill Ellis, there would never have been a Tools for Schools Broward Store on Copans Road.” This program has brought more than \$6 million in school supplies to our Broward County Public School Title 1 children.

Bill also donated to the scholarship program and was so emotionally moved after he met his first recipient, a homeless student, that he set up the annual Bill and Judy Ellis Scholarship at the Broward Education Foundation.

We also credit Bill and his employers for being instrumental in the creation of our Hall of Fame walk at the KC Wright building. Without Bill Ellis, Pirtle and DStephenson Construction we would have never realized this dream for memorializing our distinguished alumni.

We mourn his loss but know that his legacy will live on at the Broward Education Foundation.



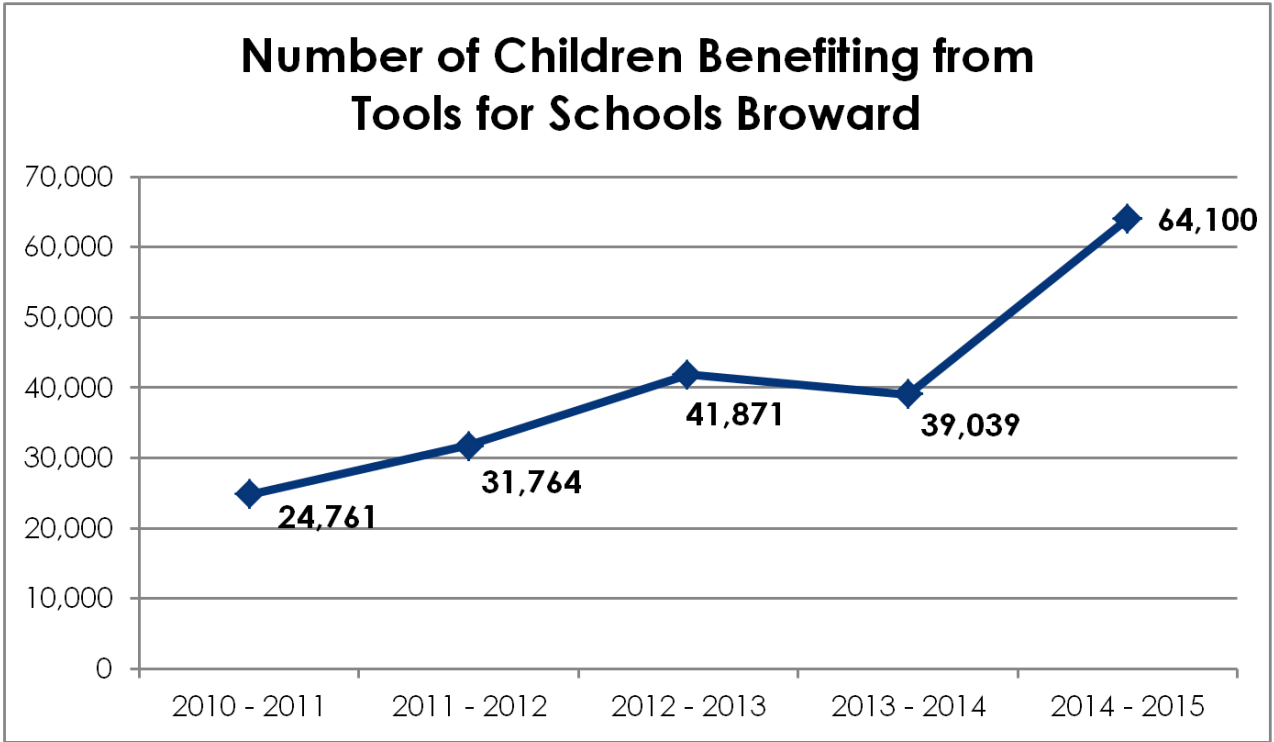

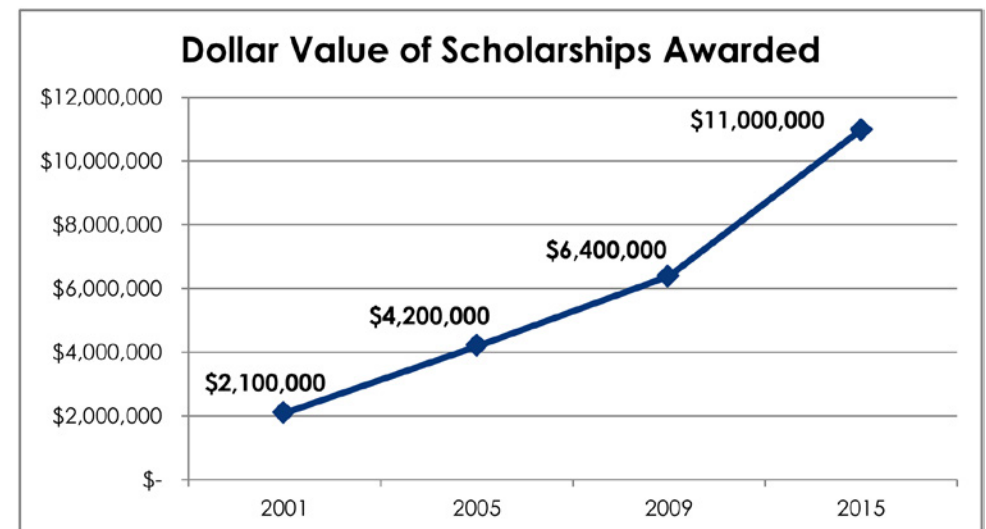
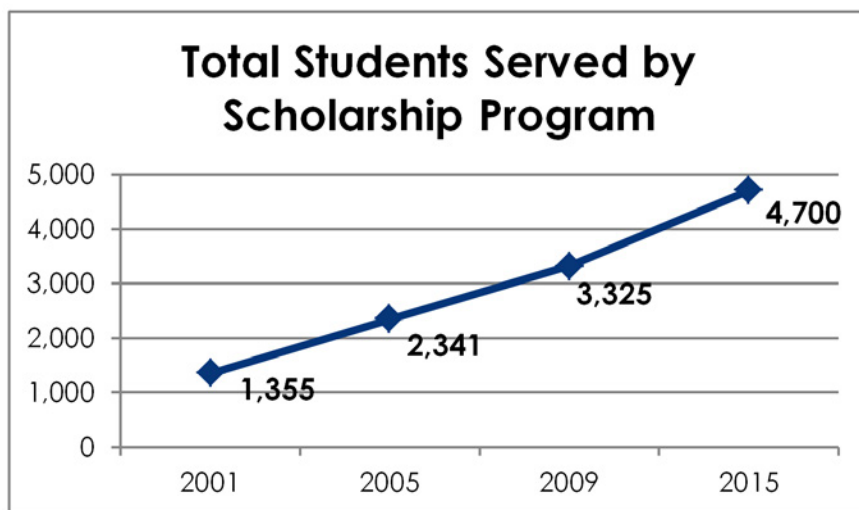
Scholarships

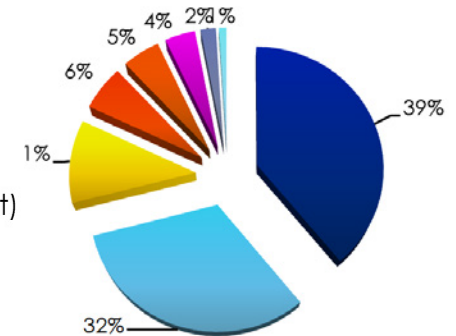

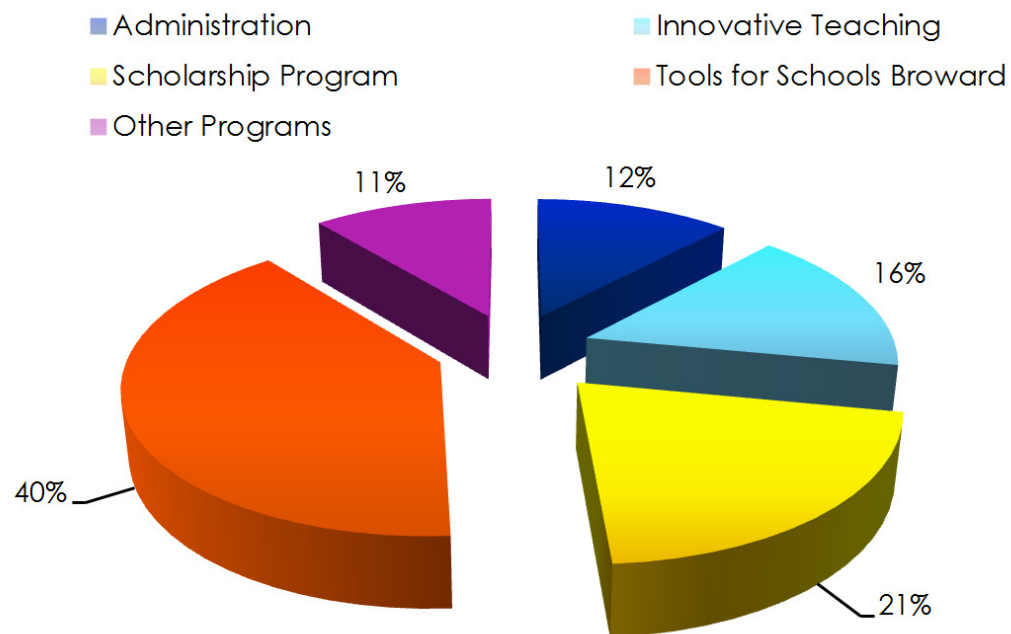

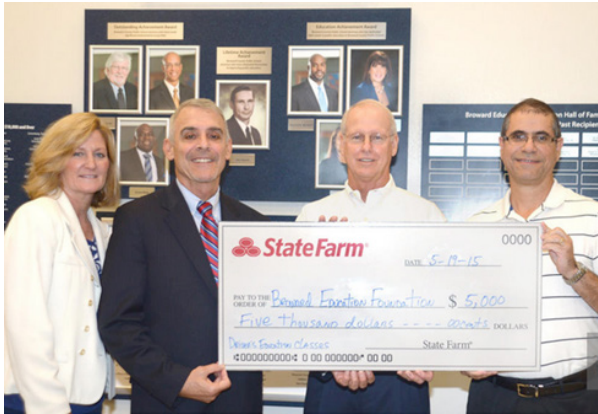
