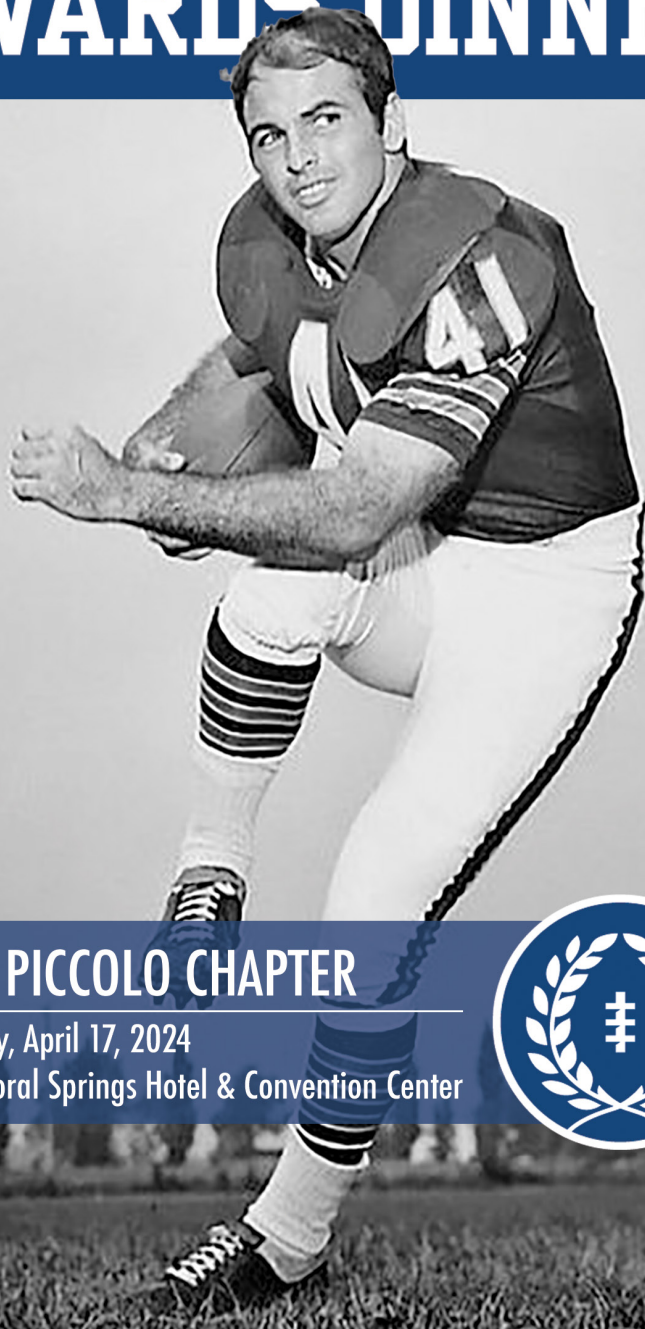

FROM THE PRESIDENT


Dear Guests,

Brian Piccolo

This Chapter of the National Football Foundation is named in honor of the memory of a man who set a shining example for the young scholar-athletes we honor here tonight.

Brian Piccolo was a fine scholar and a great athlete, but his example reaches far beyond those values. He also exemplified the higher values that can be learned through the sports experience – dedication, excellence, teamwork, sportmanship, character and courage.

He demonstrated those qualities through a short career and a short life, so well that, although he was struck down by cancer in the prime of life at 26, his name stands on the roster of the immortals of football, and his life and death stand as examples for all of us.

Brian played at Saint Thomas Aquinas in Fort Lauderdale. He was the best that Saint Thomas ever produced. In college at Wake Forest, he led the nation in scoring and rushing with a team that could hardly get out of its own way, much less make a route for him.

For the Bears, he sometimes started. More often he played behind Gale Sayers, a great running back who was also Brian's roommate. Gale Sayers was a true friend and would give blood when Brian needed it to fight cancer.

Brian's fame has far outdistanced his football ability. It is the man

who people remember, the flashing smile and the blocky torso. The battler. Too slow and too small to play pro football. Too determined not to make it. Too tough to admit that cancer held him fast that winter of 1970 and that it would not let go.

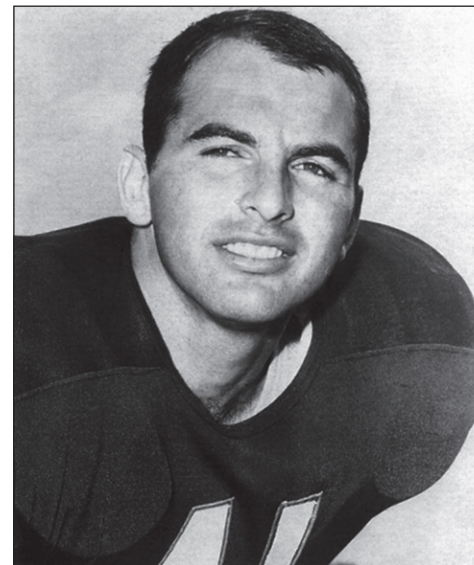
Brian's Song, the movie, made him known far beyond professional football. This, the way most people remember him – the

stylized version of Brian Piccolo portrayed by an actor. The dying "Pick" to whom Sayers at an awards banquet would dedicate his own trophy for being the National Football League's Most Courageous player of 1969, saying: "It is mine tonight, it is Brian Piccolo's tomorrow. I love Brian Piccolo, and I'd like all of you to love him, too. Tonight, when you hit your knees, please ask God to love him..."

For the rest of us there was another Piccolo to remember. A boy not yet in high school, hovering near the field of the then Central Catholic waiting for a stray football to bounce his way. Eagerly,

he would pounce on it and fire it back toward the players, who were older and his heroes.

Who was to know that he would pass by all the heroes of his neighborhood... and his state... and then his sport to become remembered as someone much more than the running back for the Chicago Bears.



Brian Piccolo became a symbol of courage. It is to him that

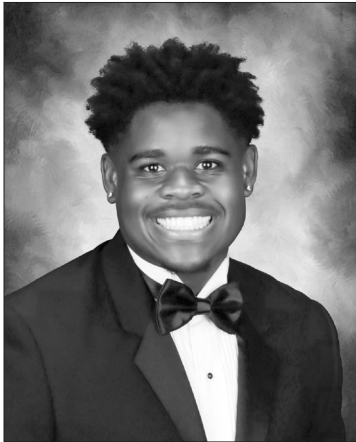
this Chapter is dedicated, perhaps to provide us all with that marvelous opportunity to answer, when another small boy one day waits impatiently by a field hoping for a loose football, and asks in an idle moment: "Who was this guy Piccolo who has a stadium named for him and also a Chapter of the National Football Foundation?"

He was a gentleman, a football great, and a brave man.

Dr. Edward J. Storey
Founder of the Brian Piccolo Chapter



"In the early years of the Foundation there were no chapters, only the big dinner in New York at the Statler Hotel. My old football coach at the University of New Hampshire was one of the initiators.

While coaching at Mamaroneck, New York, I attended every year. For a 'kid coach' it was a great night. I was accepted by the old timers, among them, Pop Warner, Rockne, Lou Little and all the Ivy League coaches, as well as Chick Meehan of NYU and Jim Crowley of Fordham.

"After Vin (Vincent de Paul) Draddy became president of the national foundation, along with Bill Morton, another New Rochelle football player, I kept on going to the dinners. I don't remember when Vin suggested that I start a chapter in Fort Lauderdale, but he did. I gathered the original group for a luncheon. He came down from Palm Beach, and we were off . . . "

The year was 1975. Among those summoned by Doc Storey was J. Millard Cain, then Vice President/circulation director of Gore Newspapers, a "Big Daddy" in local amateur football and active in Fort Lauderdale's Touch-down Club. They were joined by a group of business executives and educators. Driven by love of football and moved to gain recognition for high school seniors outstanding in the game, in scholastics and in extracurricular activities, the

group organized and received its charter at a ceremonial dinner May 27, 1975 at Tamarac Country Club. The chapter was named for Brian Piccolo in his memory and to exemplify his great legend as an inspiration to all involved in scholastic football.

The chapter held its first Scholar Athlete dinner April 6, 1976. There were twenty-five nominees, freshly scrubbed, self-conscious, yet proud of being honored. Coach Bobby Bowden of Florida State delivered an inspiring speech and the ballroom at the Galt Ocean Mile Hotel reverberated with applause for him and for the young scholar-athlete candidates.

For Doc Storey and the officers and directors of the Brian Piccolo Chapter it was a night of fulfilment and a mandate to continue to work for the objectives of the Chapter and the national foundation.

Since that first awards dinner over 48 years ago, The Brian Piccolo Chapter has paid tribute to over 1,500 scholar-athlete nominees and has made special presentations to citizens for their contributions to the community and our country, and to the game of football.

Doc Storey saw a need to recognize the scholar-athlete and through his efforts, this chapter was founded. Doc Storey passed away in 1988 at the age of 87.

FOOTBALL

By Dr. Edward J. Storey

Football is the name of the game. It is played in Europe, South Africa, New Zealand, Australia and the United States. It has been my pleasure to see this game played in all these countries except South Africa.

Billions of words have been written about it since it began in the year 1000. When the Norman soldiers were given a week for recreation after winning the Battle of Britain from the Danes, they used their big swords to dig up Danish bodies in the cemeteries. Historians tell us that as the skulls collected they kicked them around. From the random kicking came the game we know some 900 years later as football, or perhaps soccer. When young Webb first carried the ball at Rugby, he gave a new dimension to this game and it became known as Rugby.

Through the years, Americans have changed many ideas that they have imported and this game of football is quite typical. American football is unique. Canadian football is the nearest to it among the other countries.

This game has been discussed, argued over, analyzed and enjoyed by millions of people in the world. On a Sunday afternoon here in our country it has been estimated that 100 million people have watched it. This game has been played by Presidents of the U.S., paupers in Harlem, a Justice of the Supreme court and many famous generals of our defense forces.

What moves people to football? Are we haunted by the smell of sweat and the roar of the crowd?

We, the players, have played this magnificent, wild, extravagant, difficult and dangerous game. Played it, not merely watched it being played. Those who have

played it know the desperate excitement, the fears and the despair. The others who have played it feel it as we feel it. It is this which gives the game its power over our memories and our minds. This power, many people who have not played the game or have been close to it cannot understand and find it incredible.

It is this, too, which gives the game something more than its power over us and the potential importance to our troubled society. Particularly is this true where the troubles are the troubles of the young. One of the deepest troubles of the young in our world is the lack of common risks and the understanding of these risks which seem to provide the lack of delight in common labor. They need experiences like the playing on a team in a sport like football to gain the work experience and the feeling of satisfaction when the work produces a win.

Winning is not a sometime thing: You don't win once in a while if you are always trying for the best. Men like Dr. Salk do not stop their research after conquering one disease. They go on for more. They have a deep interest in the welfare of man.

It is true that football is highly competitive and it draws competitive men. The objective of the game is to win - fairly and squarely - decently by the rules - but to win. There is something in good men that really yearns for... needs... discipline and the harsh reality of head to head combat. Football provides for these opportunities.

I believe that any man's finest hour is the moment when he has worked his heart out in a good cause and he lies exhausted on the field of battle victorious. The opportunity is provided in the game.
