

New Found Glory

Recognized for their positive impact on youth across the country and recipient of the JM Family Enterprises, Inc. Bravo! Award, New Found Glory is a hometown favorite punk-pop band. Known for their high energy performances, the national recording artists have amassed an immense fan following.

Formed in Coral Springs in the summer of 1997 by proud graduates from Marjory Stoneman Douglas and J.P. Taravella High Schools, New Found Glory has been going strong ever since. Bandmates Jordan Pundik, lead vocals, lan Grushka on bass guitar, Chad Gilbert, lead guitar and backing vocals, and Cyrus Bolooki on drums have a lengthy recording career.

Most notably, New Found Glory headlined and organized a benefit concert at Pompano Beach Amphitheater, raising more than \$115,000 for the victims of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas tragedy. Stoneman Douglas '95 graduate Grushka credits his formative guitar and bass class as an integral part of his musical successes and his football coach, Jim Mathisen, as his biggest influence.

In addition to the concert for Stoneman Douglas, members support Pick Collectors Against Cancer, a non-profit which auctions collectible musical items to raise money for cancer foundations and a charity that raises funds for call centers for youth experiencing depression and suicidal thoughts. New Found Glory also raised more than \$10,000 for Broward Gold Coast Down Syndrome Organization.

The City of Coral Springs declared November 13, 2002 New Found Glory Day and gave the band a key to the city. Worldwide, fans know the band is from Coral Springs and the band has multiple t-shirt designs to prove it. Broward County is, and always will be, home for them.

Together they believe what's most important is the mental health of students. It's crucial to make sure kids feel safe without fear of getting bullied. Realizing not every child has a strong support system at home, they encourage young people to open up

Mary Barba

Mary Barba always loved school and according to her mother, she'd be dressed and ready for school before anyone in the house was even awake, always eager to learn.

Today Mary brings that passion to Sheridan Technical College and High School where she is the beloved Intern Principal and Assistant Director. A Broward County native, Mary attended Sheridan Park Elementary School and Driftwood Middle School and is a graduate of Cooper City High School, class of 1981.

Mary fondly recalls many motivating teachers, administrators and coaches. One who stands out was her math teacher, Joyce Lubin, who told students they could be anything they wanted and do anything they put their minds to. This inspired Mary to excel in math and to play softball, volleyball and water polo. Excelling both academically and athletically led to Mary becoming the first female athlete from her high school to receive a full scholarship to University of Florida.

As Sheridan Tech's administrator, Mary ensured a 100% graduation rate for her first five consecutive years, an amazing feat that resulted in \$30 million in student scholarships. In one of her most impactful moments, Sheridan Technical High School was ranked one of the District's top four schools and a top 5% school in the nation by U.S. News and World Report, within its first seven years of existence. Acutely aware that there isn't a level playing field, she wanted to ensure there were opportunities for students to pursue a technical education after high school.

Among Mary's role models is her sister who recently retired from Broward County Public Schools after more than 35 years. Her hard work and passion for education inspired Mary to "be the change you want to see in the world."

In addition to University of Florida, Mary also attended Florida Atlantic University, Nova Southeastern University and St. Thomas University, earning an MBA and an MS in both Education Leadership and Education Law.

He's a staunch advocate for underserved students and strives to provide racial equity and equal opportunities for all.

Antonio attended North Fork Elementary School, Parkway Middle School and is a proud graduate of Dillard High School class of 2003.

Antonio had many positive roles models and inspiring teachers. He fondly remembers his teachers Mrs. Terney, Mr. Nieves and Mrs. White- now, much to his delight, they are his colleagues. His middle school principal, Mr. Dudley taught him life lessons such as how to dress and wear a belt. Mrs. Poe, his high school guidance counselor made sure he stayed on track and graduated. Antonio considers all his teachers to have been a blessing. He lives by the motto they instilled "that every student counts and every moment matters."

As the SFL district coordinator for the 5,000 Role Models of Excellence Project, a mentoring program for marginalized young men, Antonio provides leadership and guidance to more than 20 site directors in Broward County Public Schools. He recruited more than 100 adult men in various professions to encourage these young men to see their potential. Securing more than \$25,000 in grants and scholarships to provide access and opportunities for these students, this initiative has led to an incredible 100% graduation rate.

Antonio received the 2021 National Alliance of Black School Educators Leadership Award-Broward County Chapter; Legacy magazine's 40 Under 40 Award in 2016; and the Alpha Kappa Alpha Fatherhood Award in 2017, among others. He remains involved with Boys and Girls Clubs, Eta Nu Education Foundation, and the alumni associations of Dillard High School and Florida A&M.

Antonio graduated from Florida A&M University with a Bachelor of Science in Political Science and a master's degree in education.

Debra 'Debbi' Hixon is a 32-year nationally certified teacher in Broward County and serves as a countywide Broward County School Board member, Seat 9.

Born and raised in Hollywood, Debbi attended Hollywood Hills Elementary, Olsen Middle and graduated in 1984 from South Broward High School (SBHS). She credits Mrs. Gloria McIntosh (Ms. Mac), her 10th grade biology teacher, with making an indelible, positive influence on her life. Her long-standing relationship with Ms. Mac, whom she calls "the standard that all science teachers should be measured by," inspired Debbi to become an environmental advocate and molded her into the popular science teacher she became at SBHS.


Prior to South Broward, Debbi taught science and was a swim coach at Blanche Ely High School. As magnet coordinator of the Maritime/Marine Science and Technology Program, she created a student scholarship and intern Career Launch Competition with the Marine Industries Association of South Florida.

As a teacher and mother of a special needs student, Debbi is on the Parent and Community Involvement Task Force where she helped plan and implement BCPS's Parent University, introducing new teaching methods and technologies to enhance virtual school experiences during the pandemic. Her primary goals and motivation are to keep schools safe, expand mental health support for students and staff, provide teachers and support staff with adequate pay and resources they need to help students succeed, and build open and positive relationships between schools and communities.

Debbi is president of the Chris Hixon Athletic Scholarship Foundation, dedicated to the memory of her husband, Stoneman Douglas High School Athletic Director. Debbi serves on the Stand With Parkland board advocating for practical public safety reforms focused on the safety of children and staff at school, improved mental health support and responsible firearms ownership. She is vice president of 4FNOW, partnering with local law enforcement to host voluntary gun buyback programs.

A Broward County resident for more than 40 years, Cindy graduated in 1977 from Northeast High School where one of her favorite teachers was Mrs. Rosemary Timoney who taught Latin and offered endless encouragement.

As a Comcast executive, Cindy was a prominent leader in the cable and telecommunications industries. She developed impactful marketing and communications campaigns earning multiple top honors from the National Cable Television Association, Cable Television Public Affairs Association and the Cable Television Association of Marketers.

Among the former Broward Education Foundation board member's successful endeavors was promoting License for Learning, a State of Florida education license plate initiative. She jumpstarted the campaign by outfitting Comcast's South Florida fleet of vehicles with the tags which helped to raise an impressive amount of funds and awareness for Broward County Public Schools and Broward Education Foundation.

Other significant initiatives Cindy developed include Cable in the Classroom and the Critical Viewing Initiative with the Florida PTA. She raised more than \$20 million in federal, state and local mentoring program and student scholarship funding for Take Stock In Children. She worked closely with the late Dr. Phyllis Schiffer-Simon at BECON-TV to develop a formidable public/private partnership that promoted and aired vital after school educational programming throughout Broward County.





Thomas Good, Jr. is a Navy veteran who serves as Vice Mayor for the City of Pembroke Pines, where he was first elected as City Commissioner in 2018. He has spent much of his career as a devoted public servant.

Thomas attended Sheridan Park Elementary and Driftwood Middle School and upon graduation from Cooper City High School in 1977, he joined the military. Unsure of his path, and coming from an economically challenged home, financing a degree from a four-year university was not a viable option. He enlisted at the naval recruitment office in Pembroke Pines and served in the Navy for six years while stationed on the USS Caron.

Honored to have served in the U.S. Military, Thomas is a staunch advocate for those who've served. He volunteers with support agencies, promoting and sponsoring programs and generating awareness of the importance of honoring veterans in the community.

Thomas supports advancing collaborative partnerships between municipalities, trade associations and school district's vocational education programs. He is confident that students can benefit greatly by learning vital skills that can lead to meaningful careers. Thomas points to his own high school experience when he enrolled in a high school auto mechanic class. His teacher, Mr. Joiner, taught him that overcoming the challenges in diagnosing and fixing an automobile increased his knowledge and his ability to utilize those same deductive lessons in any setting. To this day, Thomas believes that to continually improve and succeed, one must practice overcoming resistance.

A recipient of a Rotary International Paul Harris Fellow Award, Miramar Pembroke Pines Chamber Pinnacle Award and Miramar Park Homeowners Group Advocate of the Year, Thomas is also a member of Broward League of Cities, Phi Theta Kappa National Honor Fraternity, Kiwanis International, American Legion, Elks USA, Rotary International and Honor Flight.
