

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LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD



John Aycock, who passed away in July at age 84, is credited with being a maverick, change agent and strong advocate for quality education. He retired from the School Board of Broward County after a 35-year career and was a South Florida resident for 82 years. After his tenure as a United States Marine, Aycock received both his Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degrees of Education from the University of Florida.

A father of three daughters, John began his career as an educator, in 1953 teaching English, math and social studies to students at the Naval Air Station School and then became Dean of McNicol Junior High. He was the first principal of Driftwood Junior High School, founded the horticultural program at McArthur High School as Principal and served as area superintendent.

Mr. Aycock was principal at the Boyd Anderson High for 15 years, serving the longest tenure of any high school principal in the District. He created the International Baccalaureate program for high achieving, motivated students. This program remains today.

Edwin H. Moore, PhD, a 1969 graduate of John D. McArthur High School, is president and CEO of the Independent Colleges and Universities of Florida, based in Tallahassee. He also serves as the executive director of the Higher Education Facilities Finance Authority and the CEO of the Florida Independent College Fund, a non-profit organization.

Previously, he held numerous executive positions with the Florida House of Representatives and was executive director of the Broward County Community Mental Health Board. His extensive community involvement includes serving as an ex-officio member of The Florida Council of 100, a member of the Florida Higher Education Coordinating Council and co-chair of the Associated Industries of the Florida Higher Education Council. He also serves on the state board of directors for the Children's Home Society and was a member of Governor Rick Scott's transition team.

Looking back on his stellar career and long list of awards, Dr. Moore recalls being a high school junior during the tumultuous '60s. He wanted to drop out of school and work at Winn Dixie until Ms. Covert in guidance turned him around. "She worked hard to keep me focused and on track," he recalled. "She showed me why it mattered. She made all the difference in my life."

EUGENE K. PETTIS

In June 2013, Eugene Pettis, a 1978 graduate of Stranahan High School and co-founder of the Fort Lauderdale law firm Haliczer Pettis & Schwamm, was elected as the first African American president of the Florida Bar. He also was appointed by Governor Lawton Chiles as the first African American to serve on the South Florida Water Management District's Governing Board, where he rose to become vice chair. A current trustee at the University of Florida's Levin College of Law, he spent eight years on the University's Foundation Board of Directors.

Recognized by the American Board of Trial Advocates as the Trial Lawyer of the Year in 2013, he also was recognized by the Urban League of Broward County with the Margaret Roach Humanitarian Award.

He credits four teachers and being a founding member of his high school's Horizon Club for teaching him such life skills as leadership, strategic planning and organization. "Their guidance put me on the right track for the rest of my life," he wrote.

ERRICT RHETT

A 1989 graduate of John D. McArthur High School, Errict Rhett is a former American college and professional football player and NFL running back for seven years. While at the University of Florida, he was recognized as an All-American. Today, he is the chief executive officer of Errict Rhett Custom Homes and the Errict Rhett Foundation, which benefits underprivileged children through such programs as after-school activities, college scholarships and mentoring.

Each year he takes into his home for one-on-one mentoring, four to five young adults from low-income families and helps them achieve their dreams of attending college. He recalls his high school football coach, Roger Mastrantonio, sending every graduating senior on the team to college with full scholarships. "This particular experience would impact my life forever," he said. "I know what we as Broward citizens can accomplish when we collectively come together for the common good." D. DESMOND K. BLACKBURN

Desmond K. Blackburn, Ph.D., the chief school performance and accountability officer for Broward Schools, graduated in 1992 from Piper High School. He began his career in education in 1996 as a high school math teacher, and since then has worked as an assistant principal, principal, district teacher, director of school improvement, area superintendent and adjunct professor.

He has been honored by the Broward Chapter of the National Alliance of Black School Educators and the Upsilon Xi Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority. Legacy Magazine named him one of the 2014 Broward's 50 Most Powerful Black Business Leaders. He recently served as co-chairperson of the Lauderhill YMCA Board of Directors.

A member of his high school track team, he learned that mental and physical conditioning were essential to professional success. "Coach Melvin Harris would always tell me that lack of conditioning would make a coward out of me," he wrote. "Lack of mental conditioning, reading and researching, makes us hesitant, cowardly."

LYNN GOLDMAN

A 1975 graduate of Nova High School, Lynn Goldman is the coordinator of community relations for Broward Technical Centers. She has worked for Broward Schools since 1998. Her long list of professional and charitable involvement includes leadership positions with the Fort Lauderdale and Davie/Cooper City Chambers of Commerce, South Florida Education Center, Broward Alliance and Leadership Broward Foundation. She volunteers her time for Fight for Sight, Temple Sinai of Hollywood, the B'nai Brith Youth Organization and the Broward Technical Center Scholarship Foundation.

She has devoted her energies on the job and in her personal time as an advocate for students, including serving as chair of the District Advisory Council. She remembers Mr. James Noble, her 4th grade teacher, as her favorite. "Mr. Noble was a man of great moral character and knew how to navigate the fine line between fun and respect," she wrote.

JENNIFER HAMILTON

Jennifer Hamilton graduated from Stranahan High School in 1992 and today is athletic director at her alma mater, where she started in 1999 as a health and first aid teacher. She has been twice named Teacher of the Year at the school and received the 2007 Miami Dolphin's Teacher of the Week award. She also was recognized with the FAU Outstanding Professional Educator Alumni Award. She volunteers her time to support Broward County Recycle Partnership, the Angel Tree Drive and the American Lung Association. Among her many achievements is the "Ninth Grade Academy," which she started to showcase student works and encourage high achievement.

She strives to empower her students and sees herself as their "defender" because she has "walked in their shoes." "I was very poor and the first person in my father's immediate family to graduate from high school, let alone to go to college. If it wasn't for my teachers and coaches, I would have never broken the cycle," she wrote. "I am the one in the shadows cheering them on, making the classroom nonthreatening and enjoyable, nudging them to be at their best capacities and strive for nothing but excellence."

Twan Russell

MIAMI DOLPHINS Sr. Director of Community Affairs

Born and raised in Fort Lauderdale, a student of Broward County Public Schools, Mr. Russell currently serves as Sr. Director of Current Affairs for the Miami Dolphins.

Mr. Russell is a graduate of the University of Miami with a Bachelor's Degree in criminology and broadcasting communications, along with a minor in English. While in college, Russell also realized the importance of giving back to the community, most importantly *his* community. During these years, he vowed to personally make a difference.

Before joining the Miami Dolphins organization, Mr. Russell excelled in sports as a professional athlete, playing in the NFL. During his NFL career, Russell played the linebacker position for the Washington Redskins, the Miami Dolphins and the Atlanta Falcons. Due to an injury, he decided to retire from professional football in November 2004.

Mr. Russell and his mother, Corliss Ann Russell, a retired 30+ year teacher of Lauderhill Middle School, began The Russell Life Skills and Reading Foundation, Inc. The Foundation is a 501(c) (3) nonprofit organization that was formed to "tackle" the high illiteracy rate of inner city youth and the lack of educational resources available to them. Its mission is, "Opening Books to Open Doors," with the overall goal of eradicating illiteracy among inner city youth and empowering, inspiring and encouraging at-risk youth to become successful citizens.

Through his Foundation's multi-faceted after-school program, Russell continues to demonstrate to children that statistics are just what they are – numbers and figures on a piece of paper. The only way to achieve anything is through literacy. For Twan, it is truly a testament that opening books does open doors.




