

Nitin Motwani


From kindergarten through 12th grade, Nitin Motwani attended Harbordale Elementary, Sunrise Middle School and graduated as valedictorian from Fort Lauderdale High School, class of 1997. He graduated from Duke University and later Columbia University, where he earned a Master of Science in Real Estate Development.

Nitin credits his fifth-grade teacher, Ms. Mannee, for the positive impact she had on his life. She helped Nitin become a better student and was also instrumental in developing his confidence at a young age, encouraging him to step out of his comfort zone and act in a play about Irving Berlin. Nitin was honored when she attended his wedding nearly 20 years later.

Nitin believes it's imperative that mentorship programs are available for students and continuing education for teachers. Along with his family, Nitin believes strongly in the value of education and its impact. To nurture the talent of students in the community, the Motwani family established Broward College's R. Motwani Family Academy of Hospitality and Tourism Management.

An award-winning real estate developer and investor, Nitin is the managing partner of both Merrimac Ventures, where he is involved in all aspects of acquisitions, development, and capital markets for mixed-use projects and hotel, office, retail and residential assets, and Miami Worldcenter Associates, where he oversees the largest urban development project underway in Miami and among the largest in the U.S.

An active member of the greater South Florida business community, Nitin serves on the board of University of Miami's Master of Real Estate Development program and previously served as board chair. He is a member of the Young Presidents' Organization's Miami and Global Chapter, Urban Land Institute, International Council of Shopping Center, and City Year's Red Jacket Society. He served on the Miami Downtown Development Authority board for 15 years and was the co-chair of the enterprise committee. A Haitian immigrant with a profound love of her heritage, Wilnar Julmiste knows firsthand the disconnect between the immigrant community's needs and available community resources. Her determination to help immigrant families like her own is personal.

Wilnar attended Carver Middle School and Fort Lauderdale High School, class of 2000, where her teacher, Dr. Noel made a lasting impact. Wilnar is grateful for Dr. Noel and his wife who invested their time and love in her success. She credits the couple and many of her former teachers in the Broward County Public School System with helping fulfill her dream of attending college at Florida A&M University. She is thankful that Fort Lauderdale High School had an excellent pre-law program and other law-related activities which were a springboard into a fulfilling career in law.

Wilnar earned her J.D at Stetson University College of Law and founded her own law firm, Julmiste Legal. Now she helps bridge the gap for immigrants by providing affordable and pro bono legal services. Wilnar serves on the Board of the Haitian Lawyers Association, Legal Aid Society Palm Beach County and is active with the Florida Justice Association. She received the Florida Association for Women Lawyers Leaders in the Law Award and was recognized by Legacy Magazine as one of the 40 under 40 Black Leaders.

With many students facing a variety of external challenges, Wilnar believes individual and collective community involvement and advocacy are necessary for positive change, whether that's through community partnerships, volunteering, or making financial contributions.

Active in the community, she volunteers with Women of Tomorrow and developed a youth advancement program at Grace Tabernacle Church. Coming full circle, Wilnar is a proud recipient of a Broward Education Foundation scholarship and a former Broward Education Foundation board member.



Jocelyn Reid

Jocelyn Reid grew up in the Broward County Public School System, attending Lauderdale Manors and Larkdale Elementary, Lauderdale Lakes Middle School, and Boyd Anderson High School, class of 1990. Throughout her education, she was blessed to have caring, knowledgeable educators who motivated her to become the best she could be.

It was Jocelyn's fifth-grade teacher, Mrs. Jones, a beautiful, refined, yet lovingly stern woman who took extra time to impart guidance and lasting wisdom which put her on the path to a career in education. Jocelyn recalls feeling an incredible sense of pride knowing that her teacher held a special meeting just for the girls. She encouraged them, counseling them not to let any situation keep them from their goals despite race, poverty, or naysayers. To Jocelyn, that was profoundly empowering. Sadly, Mrs. Jones tragically and unexpectedly died during childbirth when Jocelyn was only in sixth grade, but from then on, she knew that she wanted to continue her teacher's legacy.

Jocelyn says it's been a pleasure serving Broward County Public Schools for the past 27 years as a teacher, curriculum specialist, assistant principal, and now principal at Walker Elementary in Fort Lauderdale considered one of the most critical schools in all of Broward County.

Throughout her career, she's worked exclusively in Title I Schools, breaking stereotypes and creating a culture of high expectations, demonstrating that students in underserved schools can be successful academically. She has earned multiple honors and accolades, including Dillard Elementary's Teacher of the Year and as a JM Family "African American Achievers" in Education nominee. Whether at school or through her involvement in many charitable organizations including the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, 5,000 Role Models of Excellence, or Girl Scouts of Southeast Broward, Jocelyn always tries to motivate her students, especially the girls, to instill the same sense of self-worth and self-respect Mrs. Jones imparted upon her.



Joseph Quechauer

With impeccable credentials in music education and supervision, Joseph Luechauer has seen firsthand how students can be enriched by studying music, theater, and the fine arts. Those students tend to have higher graduation rates, score better on standardized tests, and have much higher attendance levels.


Joseph's love of music began with Mrs. Madeline Stein, his first-grade music teacher at Orange Brook Elementary School in Hollywood, whose energy was infectious. At Olsen Middle School he learned the baritone horn, trombone, and string bass and was honored to play in the All-State Band under the direction of Mr. Robert Raabe, an experience that led to his eventual career in music education. But it was at South Broward High School, under the direction of Edward Parsons, that sealed the deal for Joseph to become a professional music educator.

Joseph recalls how fortunate he was to be heavily active in the arts from kindergarten through 12th grade. Thanks to his education within the Broward County Public Schools system, he was awarded a full university scholarship and graduated college with honors.

As past president of the Florida Music Education Association, Joseph administered a \$1.5 million budget and was responsible for overseeing the state conference attended by 10,000 educators and performers. He worked in tandem with the Florida Department of Education to craft educational policies and legislation for the benefit of all Florida students. As Broward County Public Schools Curriculum Supervisor, Music and Performing Arts K-12, Joseph was awarded the Florida Music Education Association's Innovative Project Award for the development and implementation of the Elementary Music Performance Assessment program.

Joseph is deeply involved in and volunteers in the Rise Against Hunger Program at his church, which packages 20,000 meals for the homeless and at-risk families in the community. He also serves as an adult leader of the Boy Scouts of America.

The recipient of multiple "Teacher of the Year" accolades, among other deserving awards, Jeannie Krouch's educational journey from student to teacher has always been centered in Broward County.

Grateful for the numerous teachers who had a profound and positive influence on her life starting at Oriole Elementary School, Lauderdale Lakes Middle School and Dillard High School, class of 1992, Jeanie became an educator thanks in large part to the guidance and mentorship she received while attending Broward County Public Schools.

Mrs. Zahler, her sixth-grade science teacher, emphasized female empowerment within a male-dominated field and encouraged Jeannie to embrace experimentation and recognize that a wrong answer is simply a path toward discovery. Another memorable teacher was Mr. McLaughlin, who taught English honors in her senior year. While studying the Renaissance Period, Jeannie fondly recalls how he brought the lesson to life through a Renaissance Fair. Active learning was much more engaging than any textbook.

These dedicated teachers were an inspiration to Jeannie, an Equity Liaison at Westchester Elementary School. They ignited her love of interactive learning and collaborative teaching methods that she applies in her classroom today.

In her current role, Jeannie champions inclusivity and enlightens fellow educators while helping all students feel safe and supported regardless of race, gender, ethnicity, language, ability, or sexual orientation while designing lesson plans that significantly impact student achievement and foster positive attitudes.

From transformative experiences she's led at Westchester Elementary, to the workshops she's orchestrated at Broward Education Foundation's Innovative Teacher IDEA EXPOs, Jeannie has witnessed the vital impact educators have on their students. In addition to being a wife and mother, she is passionate about the arts and is a member of the Decorative Painters Society Sunstrokes, Florida Chapter where she paints memory boxes for hospice patients, and is involved with the Southern Handcraft Society of Coral Springs which delivers school supplies, clothing and food to the underserved.
